## Reviews

### Academic

**[Brown]** They offer a wide variety of Advanced Placement classes (which can be taken for college credit). Most classes are discussion-based, and are focused around a "Harkness" table rather than the traditional desks.

Middlesex School strives to keep their students very well-rounded, and every student takes a good mixture of diverse classes (including art and drama).

**[Dartmouth]** Very strong English department with excellent writing program. Math and science are also strong. Foreign language is the weakest.

**[Middlebury College]** The intensity of discussion, the difficulty of grading and the amount of course work are all very similar to college. Middlesex offers one of the most advanced curriculums with math classes up to vector and multivariable calculus, numerous AP courses, and a general intelligence of student body which makes even regular courses advanced. The work load can be daunting at times. Class scheduled from 8am to 7:30pm on a given day and then having several hours of course work can make Middlesex exhausting at times.

### College Counseling

**[Brown]** College counseling at Middlesex School is as comprehensive as can be.

**[Dartmouth]** The current counseling director was a former admissions officer at Harvard and is full of knowledge and useful connections in the admissions world. Counselors are very accessible.

### Admissions Process

**[Brown]** The student body is very diverse with very well-rounded students. My advise is just to be yourself!

**[Dartmouth]** Middlesex favors well rounded students who are self-motivated and hard working. While you need higher test scores students must possess a particular talent or skill that they can develop over their time at Middlesex

**[Middlebury]** Middlesex's admission policy requires students to write an essay while visiting.

### Extra-Curricular Activities

**[Brown]** There are a wide variety of extracurricular activities available. Every student is required to participate in sports each season.

**[Dartmouth]** With successful athletics, an award winning theater department and thriving art department students are able to fill their time in constructive ways

**[Middlebury]** Middlesex's extra-curricular are numerous and rewarding. In athletics, Students are required to play a sport for 3 seasons in their freshman a sophomore years, two in their junior year, and one in their senior year.

### Quality of School Life

**[Brown]** Middlesex is a very cheerful environment. It is in a very good neighborhood (Concord, MA), and the campus is pretty closed in and isolated from the town.

**[Dartmouth]** Facilities and dormitories are top notch and the food isn't half bad. The school is located in Concord, MA, a small, historic, safe town located roughly 15 minutes from Boston.

**[Middlebury]** While the stresses of academics and multiple extra-curricular activities can be many, quality of life is generally very good. Students find a way to establish equilibrium between their work and their social life and their own leisure. With the sheer amount of work required of students and classes six days a week, it is almost impossible to have a perfect quality of life, but the feeling of accomplishment provided by achieving at a very high level as Middlesex demands makes up for what at times are very long weeks.
