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Reviews

Academic

[Harvard] Academic program centers on the belief that the best preparation for college is a liberal arts education. 3 year language requirements, two year history requirements, four year English requirements, and two or three term Arts requirements. Science and math are four year requirements. Regular level courses, to Honors courses, and Advanced Placements APs. Over 20 APs to choose from. It is extremely difficult to get into the top classes. Grades of A- are required in regular courses before recommendations for AP. Medium workload in regular classes, very large workload in honors and advanced classes. Great teachers. Class size is just right: no more than 15, often only 12.

[Georgetown] Small class size—get to know teachers. Great foreign language department. Study abroad opportunities.

[Dartmouth] Prepare you well for SATs and AP exams, but not focused on exams. Class size between 10-14 students. Faculty accessible and very helpful.

College Counseling

[Harvard] Weekly meetings. Each counselor has about 30 students. Begins in the spring of Junior year. Honest—encourage you to apply to reaches and fall-backs. Have good connections with colleges. Sometimes discouraging because they are often very stressed out.

[Georgetown] Very good college counseling program. Begins Junior spring. Always get things done in time and make sure you do, too. Contact college admissions offices for their students.

[Dartmouth] “College Weekend”—February of Junior year, assigned a college counselor, fill out a survey about interests and hopes for college, and have group meetings with the college counselors in the winter term. In the spring, first one-on-one meetings and more group meetings.

Admissions Process

[Harvard] Take SSAT; scores of 88 percentiles and above highly recommended. Advice: read a lot of books. Write a good essay. Interview is important.

[Georgetown] Interview is important. Get in the 90th or so percentile on the SSATs.

[Dartmouth] Students should aim for an overall score in the top 10th percentile on the SSATs. Interviews are required, dress nicely, but do not over-dress. Have a book in mind to talk about with the interviewer.

Extra-Curricular Activities

[Harvard] Extra-curricular activities are required each and every term, unless you are taking a 6th course, or in a school play. Students have the option to pursue sports, plays, or other unique extracurricular such as yoga, debate, intramural activity, and many others. Community service is big-- this could be your extracurricular commitment. 30 hours is required before graduation.

[Georgetown] The arts program at Choate is huge.

[Dartmouth] There are numerous sports teams, both interscholastic and intramural, as well as a very large number of clubs. There are numerous performing arts groups.

Quality of School Life

[Harvard] Housing is excellent. Dining hall service is excellent Minimal interaction with the town of Wallingford; it is as if Choate is its very own town. No crime. Infirmary is always open.

[Georgetown] The dining hall food is good, especially when compared to college food. The campus is beautiful.

[Dartmouth] The rules are very strict about where you can go. The area is pretty safe. The student body is pretty diverse.
