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Reviews

Academic

[Bowdoin College] Humanities are strong. The sciences do not challenge students very much and do not prepare them for college-level science. Math classes are very challenging. Visual art classes are very good. Teachers are talented and the courses offered are interesting. Science and math classes are mostly lecture-based. Humanities classes are discussion-based. Small classes and the teachers are very accessible. The average work load is not very heavy compared to an average college work load. There are peer tutors and hired tutors. Teachers hold extra office hours and review sessions.

College Counseling

[Bowdoin College] The process starts second semester junior year. Meet with counselors at least 5 times throughout the process. More meetings can and are usually scheduled. Advisors are very helpful, connected, and experienced.

Admissions Process

[Bowdoin College] A typical application is used with interview and essays. The school isn't very selective. Everyone is pretty well-rounded. Parents should take an active role in the admissions process, but should not be overbearing.

Extra-Curricular Activities

[Bowdoin College] The music department is weak. Only an orchestra and a chorus. The advanced performance ensemble is very good, but it is selective. Other than that, extracurriculars played an important role in our experience at MPS. Required to take up a sport or participate in a sport class. Required to do community service and participate in an 80 hour educational program over longer breaks. There are a lot of clubs that met on a regular basis.
