Reviews

Academic

[Harvard] The small size of classes and fantastic teaching staff at Groton allows students to explore more deeply the world of academia. The kids you meet at Groton are some of the most intelligent and determined thinkers you will ever encounter.

[Princeton] The school has a very conservative grading rubric, which means that most students are excited to get a B or B+. Only the brightest will earn -As, and an A or +A is almost a rare exception. Teachers are bright, motivated, and often have masters or PhDs in their subject matter. Classes are usually very small and led in a seminar format in which students actively participate.

[U Penn] Class size at Groton School is no more than 15 people in a class. It is usually round table seating so everyone can see each other.

College Counseling

[Harvard] Groton has a great relationship with many universities both in the USA and abroad. The bulk of students end up at top-tier colleges. Counselors are particularly well-connected to the Ivy League admissions offices which many students find incredibly helpful.

[Princeton] Beginning early in your junior year, advisors are available whenever you need them, and they are magicians at getting your necessary paperwork done for college admissions.

[U Penn] All the counselors definitely had connections.

Admissions Process

[Harvard] The school favors well-rounded individuals. Athletic recruits also have to be intelligent.

[Princeton] Groton takes the SSAT. The interviewer will focus on what the student is doing in his classes and extracurricular. The school is thirsting for minority and economically disadvantaged students.

U Penn] The school likes well-rounded individuals because its' focus is to produce educated well-rounded alumni so it would be great to have some activities listed.

Extra-Curricular Activities

[Harvard] Groton's sports league which consists largely of other boarding schools. The drama facilities are also top-notch. While musicians can find their niche as members of the school jazz band or orchestra, there are limited other opportunities due to the small size of the school.

[Princeton] Everyone is required to take a sport each term at Groton. Your weekend is eaten up by Saturday morning classes and Saturday afternoon sports. On Sunday, all students are required to attend some kind of religious service.

Quality of School Life

[Harvard] Groton is a small school situated in rural Massachusetts. Clearly this limits students' social interactions with kids from outside of the school to a significant degree. Groton is a very safe community founded upon trust.

[Princeton] If students didn't have to attend class at Groton, it would be accurate to call the place a country club. Much of the Groton experience is influenced by the chapel. All students and faculty must attend daily services in the morning before roll call and classes.

[U Penn] Housing is seriously great. Carpet throughout the dorms, spacious rooms, heating, beautiful dining hall, Student run restaurants, great dances every weekend, interesting guest speakers, and quiet surrounding town.
