Reviews

Academic

[Dartmouth] The school focuses on small class sizes and pragmatist philosophy. A 3.3 to a 3.5 GPA is a respectable range, and will get most students with solid extra-curriculars and SAT scores admitted to an Ivy League school if they so choose. [Johns Hopkins] Small classes with lots of student participation. Teachers are required to hold an hour of office hours after school Tuesday through Friday, but are almost always available for extra help when not teaching. Rigorous courses.

College Counseling

[Dartmouth] Jon Reider is the head of Counseling. The college process starts junior year at UHS, though most people begin thinking about schools earlier. Connections with certain Universities.

[Johns Hopkins] Jon Reider is the head counselor. Develops personal relationships with each student and is invested in them.

Admissions Process

[Dartmouth] UHS typically requires a very strong middle-school record, as well as good SSAT scores and extra-curricular activities. Interviews are required, and are done by teachers, except for applicants of siblings, who are interviewed by the head admissions officer. There are definitely feeder schools, namely Town School for Boys, Hamlin School, and Marin Country Day School (MCDS), as well as Cathedral School for Boys, Katherine Delmar Burkes School, and San Francisco Day School.

[Johns Hopkins] The applicant should be academically strong and involved in extracurricular activities (they are not looking for number of different ones, but dedication and passion for one or a few). Take the SSAT during the fall of eighth grade year. An interview is required but is very casual. Feeder schools include Town School, Cathedral School for Boys, SF Day School, Hamlin, Burkes, MCDS, etc.

Extra-Curricular Activities

[Dartmouth] UHS has very strong, yet very approachable sports teams. The music department is varied. The jazz program is well accomplished.

[Johns Hopkins] The drama, music, art, outdoor education, and athletic departments follow the same goals and ideals as the school expects in its academics. The art department has brand new studios in the Sacramento Street Campus. Sports are important.

Quality of School Life

[Dartmouth] The neighborhood is pretty safe. The student body blends fairly well together; everyone shares similar professional motivations. Most of the kids come from high class backgrounds, so the school's social scene is quite preppy.

[Johns Hopkins] The classrooms and facilities are modern very nice. There four separate buildings (called campuses). The upper campus is a traditional building with beautiful architecture, high ceilings and a spacious courtyard. The middle and lower campuses

were built more recently, but are constantly updated and improved. The theater and library each have been beautifully redone in the past 7 years. The food service in the cafeteria is healthy and affordable. The surrounding neighborhood has numerous off-campus options.
