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Reviews

Academic

[Haverford College] About 150 students per grade. The classes are anywhere from 4-15 students. Schedule is well organized. Grade scale is from F-A (no A+) with art courses and physical education counting as "credit" (basically pass/fail). There are no GPA calculations done, class rankings, or AP courses (though there are Advanced Topic courses which comparably prepare students for AP tests). Independent studies offered.

College Counseling

[Haverford College] Take the PSATs in the beginning of junior year. Sometime early in second semester, students are introduced to one of three college counselors. The counselor talks with students and their families a minimum of three times that year. There are discussions on SAT vs ACT and what (certain) schools look for in a student. Students can simply stop by to talk with whenever they need to.

Admissions Process

[Haverford College] Spans four schools from PK-12 (two lower schools, one middle, and one high school). A substantial number of students (about 30-40) enter in middle school, and another 15 or so enter in high school. Tours given September through June. It is necessary to take the ERB test/ISEE (Independent School Entrance Exam). There are interviews, and often times parents interviews. The school is looking for students who will be active participants in their community.

Extra-Curricular Activities

[Haverford College] There are community service programs that involve classes and students going out and helping children and those in need throughout the year. There are intensive art programs (Theatre Company & Dance Company) that involve arts more than any major course and involve in-depth analysis and team building work. There are visual and digital art programs and classes that produce fashion shows, film festivals, and podcasts on a regular basis. There are musicals, dramas, operas and the school also offers students the opportunity to direct shows. There is a gorgeous athletic building.

Quality of School Life

[Haverford College] The food gets repetitive but is quite good. There is a two floor dining hall. The school is a large campus in the Riverdale neighborhood of NYC, which is primarily nursing homes and large mansions. It is on a hill near three public buses, two express buses to the city, and one train. Most students are of an upper-middle class Jewish background. A good amount of diversity.
